BE IT RESOLVED, the Minnesota Noxious Weed Law requires occupants, owners, or their agents to control, eradicate, or otherwise destroy noxious weeds growing on their property. This requirement is set forth in Minnesota Statute 18.181, which reads as follows:

It shall be the duty of every occupant of land or, if the land is unoccupied, the owner thereof, or his agent, or the public officials in charge thereof, to cut down, otherwise destroy, or eradicate all noxious weeds as defined in Section 18.171, Subdivision 5, standing, being or growing upon such land, or in such manner and at such times as may be directed or ordered by the Commissioner, his authorized agents, the county agricultural inspector, or by a local inspector having jurisdiction
